Matthew went through the RTTT power point presentation.

- 1. Not talking about a lot of money
- 2. Competition to see who can improve education the most
- 3. Lasts for 4 years but we're then required to do this indefinitely even if we run out of money
- 4. Need to have program up and running by 2012
- 5. It is basically Q-Comp.
- 6. RTTT involves running a Q-Comp program.
- 7. We just found out about this program at the start of December.
- 8. Dr. Montplaisir got an e-mail from the state saying we *could* get \$400,000 over 4 years.
- 9. Signing a MOU says we will look into this program but we are not committed to implement it.
- 10.Randi K. says EdMn doesn't recommend this program but they would stand by us if we get involved.

Other members' comments on this program...

-- ¹/₂ of the money is tied to Title I. During a staff development meeting, the administration said all the money would go to staff development.

--Dr. Montplaisir has expressed that he wants to sign up so we don't miss out. If we don't sign up by January 13, we can't get in from then on.

--Q-Comp didn't take off because they didn't want a negative climate among staff. Dave feels that way too.

--If the extra money comes in, some didn't think we will even see that money.

--Only 10-15 states will be chosen.

--The district could sign up without us.

--We should at least look into this so we don't look bad to the board.

--Sounds like we won't even get enough money to run the program.

The recommendation from the executive committee was as follows: We will go forward with 5 members to look into this program with adequate compensation.

Tori made a motion to send 5 members to form a committee to explore RTTT provided there will be adequate compensation. Lori seconded. Motion carried with a hand count vote.
